Ephesians 4:17-32

Put off...Put on

Read this passage carefully a couple of times, noting its main points and recalling 4:1.

A profile of sinners

1. In verses 17-19, Paul describes how the ungodly live. What are the chief characteristics he ascribes to them?

Sensuality (verse 19) Lewdness; implies sexual depravity, violence, and a refusal to recognize limits. Paul may have associated it with the ritual of prostitution and other practices at the temple of Artemis-Cybele in Ephesus.

2. What do you think hardness of heart (see verse 18) is? (See Hebrews 3:7-13.)

3. Why do you think Paul insists so emphatically in verse 17?

4. Do you think there are any warnings here for Christians? If so, what might they be?

The new life in Christ

Corrupted (verse 22). Literally, "rotting," decaying as a dying or dead thing.

5. Study Paul's summary of what the Ephesians had been taught about life in Christ (see verses 20-24). In the following chart, write the in the appropriate columns (1) the three things the Ephesians had been taught to do, and (2) how you could put each teaching into practice.

6.Do you think Paul intended these as three separate steps? Why or why not?



10. Can you find any clues in 4:25-28 as to why Paul gave this command? Think in terms of the kind of perspective on life Paul wanted the Ephesians to have.





